Rector's Report January 2023 (submitted Jan 22)

- It was only a couple days after last month's vestry meeting that a 6.4 magnitude earthquake hit Humboldt County, leaving thousands without power. Since our church was still without power on Tuesday evening Dec 20, 2022, we decided to postpone that evening's scheduled Soup Supper. We intend to offer Kathryne DeLorme's final presentation on the Prayer Labyrinth on Shrove Tuesday Feb 21 at 5:30 PM. - Despite the earthquake, we enjoyed record attendance at our Christ Mass service, held on Christmas Eve at 7 PM rather than the previous year's times of 8 or 10 PM. Apparently, some people travelled all the way from Redding to attend our service. - We also enjoyed record attendance on Christmas Day, which fell on a Sunday this year. - On Thursday January 5, Ashley and I delivered four bedroom bins (packed by Nellie, the Pattons, the Smithler kids and Steve P.) to St. Francis Fortuna, where they have been made available to people in need at the Rio Del Community Center.



Also on January 5th, <u>Sacred Ground</u> participants from Christ Church and St. Alban's gathered
in the Heritage Room for Session Five of the Film-Based Dialogue Series on Race and Faith,
which focused on Exploring Latino History. The Christ Church members currently participating
in Sacred Ground are Paul Gossard, Catherine Mace, the Rev. Anne Pierson, Thomas Swanger,
Jannetje Vrieze, and myself.



- On Sunday January 8, after the 10:30 AM Holy Eucharist, several parishioners gathered outside to help me bless and chalk the front doors.


